

NIOSA[®] Policies for Alcohol Booth Volunteers

Adopted November 18, 2010 by the Board of Directors of the San Antonio Conservation Society.

Thank you for supporting the San Antonio Conservation Society and "A Night In Old San Antonio"[®] by serving as an alcohol booth volunteer.

As a volunteer in an alcoholic beverage booth at NIOSA, you are required to subscribe to the following policies of "**A Night in Old San Antonio**" and/or the **Texas State Law**.

Booth Chair or Vice Chair **must** remain in booth while booth is open and they are responsible for signing receipts for beer.

All NIOSA alcohol booth volunteers must be a **minimum age of thirty (30) years old**.

NIOSA Policy is that the volunteer serving the drink (**Server**) must be the one who checks the ID. All servers at NIOSA **must** be TABC certified. Several TABC certification classes will be provided by NIOSA each year. If you obtain your certification on-line or at other locations you must furnish the NIOSA office with a copy of your certification. NIOSA will provide lanyards with a copy of your certification to be worn while working in the booth. Please return lanyards to booth chairman at end of shift.

We I.D. Everyone! Individuals will be required to provide valid Identification. (TX Driver's License or TX Identification Card). NIOSA policy is to **Card Everyone!**

Patrons may receive only **two (2)** servings of an alcoholic beverage per time in line.

Alcohol sales end promptly at **10:00 p.m. sharp**. **No** alcohol is to be served after this time.

Individuals under the age of 21 **will not** be served an alcoholic beverage. (Sale of an alcoholic beverage to a minor is a "Class A" misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$4,000, confinement in jail for a term not to exceed one year, or both.)

Any patron appearing to be intoxicated **will not** be served additional alcoholic beverages. Knowingly selling alcoholic beverages to an intoxicated person is a "Class A" misdemeanor.

If you have any questions about an individual's age or level of intoxication, please ask a uniformed police officer to assist you in your decision making process. **Please Say 'No' If You Are Not Sure About The Sale.** A uniformed officer will be posted at all beer booths and in or near wine booths.

If you sell alcohol to a minor (under the age of 21) or to an intoxicated person **YOU ARE LIABLE FOR A CITATION AND FINE**. Be safe – I.D. Everyone.

Health Department Regulations state there will be no eating, drinking or smoking in booths.

All volunteers in alcohol booths are required to sign the following: *Volunteer Waiver and Indemnity, Food Handler Acknowledgement Form and Alcohol Booth Volunteer Acknowledgement Form*
